ARTICULATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN ATHENS TECHNICAL COLLEGE AND CLAYTON STATE UNIVERSITY

This Articulation Agreement is hereby made and entered into by and between Athens Technical College and Clayton State University.

Purpose: Athens Technical College and Clayton State University are entering into this Articulation Agreement effective Fall 2023, in order to articulate the course offerings in their Paralegal Studies and Legal Studies programs, respectively, so that:

- Athens Technical College students who graduate with their A.A.S. in Paralegal Studies and complete certain requirements as specified in this Articulation Agreement may gain admittance to Clayton State University, and
- Athens Technical College students who are admitted to Clayton State University pursuant to this Agreement may be assured that the courses specified in this Agreement will transfer to Clayton State University, and
- Athens Technical College students who are admitted to Clayton State University will be aware
 of what courses they must take in order to earn a Bachelor of Science in Legal Studies.

In establishing this Articulation Agreement between Athens Technical College and Clayton State University, the two parties agree as follows:

Athens Technical College will provide to Clayton State University the contact directory of graduates from their A.A.S. in Paralegal Studies program for recruitment purposes to the B.S. in Legal Studies.

Agreement in Principle:

Both parties agree to extend their best efforts to ensure that the transition for A.A.S. graduates of the ABA-approved Paralegal Studies program at Athens Technical College to the ABA-approved B.S. in Legal Studies program at Clayton State University will be as smooth as possible for the students choosing to do so. This Paralegal/Legal Studies program articulation is designed to minimize loss of credit and course duplication. Both parties enter into this Articulation Agreement as cooperating, equal partners with the responsibility to maintain the integrity of their separate programs, to remain true to their institutional missions, and to maintain the spirit of this Articulation Agreement.

Agreement on Communication:

Athens Technical College and Clayton State University agree to cooperate in communicating with each other and with their publics concerning the articulation relationship between the two institutions. Communications may include common publications and announcements concerning their affiliation and the specific joint programs. Announcements of this articulation, of changes in the relationship, and of new programs will have a coordinated release to the public from both institutions. The

institutions will encourage the dissemination of information about programs in this agreement with interested and qualified students, with both institutions providing advising and counseling to prospective students.

Agreement on Accreditation:

This Articulation Agreement is made contingent on both parties maintaining all applicable program and institution accreditations, including both SACSCOC accreditation and ABA approval or AAfPE institutional membership. In the event of a loss of accreditation, approval or membership by either party, the other party may terminate this Articulation Agreement upon written notice.

Agreement on Program Specifics:

The Paralegal/Legal Studies program detail shall be attached to this document and made a part hereof. Program detail will indicate each of the following:

- The specific courses to be taken at Athens Technical College needed to complete the Associate of Applied Science in Paralegal Studies;
- The Athens Technical College/Clayton State University equivalence between courses that transfer pursuant to this agreement;
- The specific courses to be taken at Clayton State University to complete the ABA-approved Bachelor of Science in Legal Studies; and
- Other student performance criteria (e.g., course grades, overall GPA).

It is agreed by both parties that any Athens Technical College student who has successfully completed all regular admissions standards and requirements indicated in the program detail will, upon application, be accepted at Clayton State University and may transfer the credits referenced in that program detail toward the relevant program degree at Clayton State University.

Agreement on Maintenance and Review:

At least one administrative or faculty member will be appointed from each participating institution to act as primary point of contact and agent for this Articulation Agreement, to speak for the institution and to communicate detail and modifications to respective faculty, advisors and others with interest at the individual institutions.

In the event that either institution elects or is required to amend the program detail, each party agrees to make every effort to accommodate the needs of the other party such that the articulation may be preserved.

In the event that either institution makes changes to courses or curriculum, the other party will be informed in writing and given the opportunity to review the changes and amend the agreement in writing as needed in order to make certain that equivalent learning outcomes are being met.

Regular review of program sub-agreements, at intervals to be set by the two institutions, and in no case less frequently than every three years, will be required. Termination of the agreement may be invoked by either party with two years' written notice. Students who begin a program prior to

termination will be given three additional years to complete the Athens Technical College portion and to be admitted to Clayton State University.

Both institutions agree to provide whatever data is needed by the other institution to support accreditation requirements.

The authorized representatives of each party signify their acceptance and approval of the terms of this Articulation Agreement by signing where indicated.

CSU will award credit for the remainder of the courses if a student has completed them successfully at Athens Tech or at another approved institution.
- Of the courses listed on the attached Athens Tech curriculum, the following classes will NOT be accepted for transfer credit for the B.S. at CSU:
 - o Paralegal Studies Electives
 - o COMP 1000-Intro to Computers
 - o PARA 2200 Paralegal Practicum
 - o PARA 2210 Paralegal Internship I
- At least nine credit hours or equivalent of legal specialty courses must be taken through synchronous instruction at Athens Tech and CSU. These classes must be taken face-to-face or synchronously online; and,
- Transfer students must comply with CSU residency requirements: A minimum of 30 semester credit hours in residence at Clayton State University. At least 21 of the 30 must be upper division hours counted toward program requirements other than free electives.
